Age: 10 and up

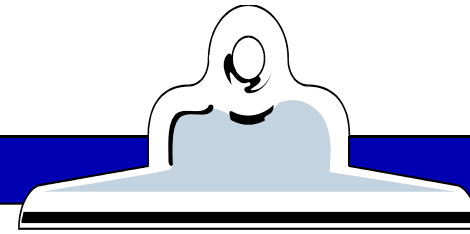
Sea Stories at the World Aquarium
